- Nominations will be open at 9am on January 7<sup>th</sup> 2026 - and close at 5pm on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2026.
- Judging will take place 6<sup>th</sup> March and finalists will be informed during the week of 9<sup>th</sup> March 2026.
- The awards ceremony will take place on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> June 2026 at Hatherley Manor Hotel and Spa, Gloucester.

## HOW TO NOMINATE A VOLUNTEER

1

Read through the award categories and descriptions carefully and decide which is the best fit.

2

Review our tips for writing your nomination. Getting all the information in your nomination really helps the judges make their decision.

3

Fill out the nomination form in as much detail as possible - there is a separate form for each category.

4

Be ready for a member of the Go Volunteer Glos team to get in touch from the 9<sup>th</sup> March 2026 if you've been selected as a finalist.

## TIPS FOR WRITING YOUR NOMINATION

The information you include in the nomination is the only information the judges have about your amazing nominee, so here are some tips to get the most from your nomination:

1. **Tell the full story** - here are some questions to consider:
  - i. Who is your nominee?
  - ii. What have they done?
  - iii. Why are they special?
  - iv. Where do they do their amazing work?
  - v. How do they help others or their community?
2. **Be yourself** - write like you are talking to a friend and tell us why the nominee means so much to you and the community.
3. **Don't worry about your writing being perfect** - the judges care about the story you tell, not about spelling or grammar.
4. **Describe the impact they have had on their community or chosen cause** - no matter what it is that your nominee does, it will certainly be making a difference to the lives of others. For example - have they supported someone to access sports in a unique way? Or perhaps they have made the green spaces in your area cleaner and therefore the community feels a nice space? There are endless ways in which volunteers have an impact and including this adds real clout to the nomination.
5. **Draft your nomination** - it can be helpful to draft your nomination ahead of time, and then input the text into the form.

## AWARD CATEGORIES



The Community Group Award celebrates the groups of volunteers who lead the way in creating change in their communities. Across Gloucestershire, there are hundreds of informal groups that are making a huge difference to the lives of others, from teams of litter pickers through to knit and natter groups – each one of them is run by a team of tirelessly dedicated volunteers for the benefit of others.

This award might be appropriate for:

- Volunteer-led groups (though groups can be facilitated by a larger organisation, for example a litter picking group receiving support from a Local Authority).
- Community groups that tackle community challenges, from food hubs to protecting green spaces.
- Groups that bring people together to connect and support each other.
- Groups that go above and beyond in creating welcoming spaces where everyone can feel like they belong.

The Rising Star Award celebrates the impact that young volunteers (under 18 years of age) have in their communities. This award shines a light on incredible children and teenagers who are already changing their community and inspiring others around them. Recognising those who look to benefit their communities, whether that is through cadets, scouting, charities or other local groups.

This award might be appropriate for someone who:

- Is aged 18 and under who brings fresh energy and brilliant ideas to their volunteer role.
- Balances education and other commitments with helping others.
- Inspires and acts as a mentor to other young people.
- Has started their own project/initiative to help local causes.

## Trustee of the Year Award

The Trustee of the Year Award celebrates good governance and the difference trustees can make to their organisations. It seeks to recognise those who often go unnoticed, working tirelessly behind the scenes to support staff and lead with vision, purpose and integrity.

This award might be appropriate for someone who:

- Has been an active board member, chair or trustee leading with unwavering dedication.
- Provides outstanding support, guidance and inspiration to their organisation.
- Always demonstrates good governance and integrity in the running of a not-for-profit organisation.
- Has been a trustee for at least a year.

## Sports Volunteer Award

The Sports Volunteer Award celebrates the dedication and energy it takes to sustain Gloucestershire's fantastic sports programmes. This award recognises the invaluable and often unseen efforts by volunteers that keep community clubs running and facilitates people of all ages and abilities to take part in sports.

This award might be appropriate for someone who:

- Is making a positive impact by enhancing access to sports within Gloucestershire
- Supports sports groups and organisations in a variety of voluntary roles such as: coaching, organising events, maintaining facilities, fundraising or administrating behind the scenes – every role is important.
- Goes above and beyond in creating a positive and supportive environment for individuals of all ages and abilities to enjoy sports, building participants' confidence, skills and enjoyment of their sport.

This award celebrates the organisations that create the best possible environment for their volunteers. From providing regular training, keeping volunteers up-to-date and expressing gratitude - being a great place to volunteer is something to be celebrated.

Who this award could be for:

- An organisation that goes above and beyond in ensuring all volunteers feel included.
- An organisation whose volunteers are continually supported and encouraged, feel empowered in their roles, and know that they're making a difference.
- An organisation who is leading the way in creating dynamic and flexible roles for volunteers.
- An organisation who successfully manages their service delivery through combining different categories of volunteers - from corporate volunteer groups to flexible volunteering.

The Lifetime Achievement Award honours volunteers who have shown a lifelong commitment to supporting and improving the communities around them. Such volunteers have given endless time and energy to causes they are passionate about, leading change and inspiring others.

This award might be appropriate for someone who:

- Has been volunteering for over ten years.
- Has had a significant positive impact through their volunteering.
- Has created a legacy for the causes they volunteer with.
- Has transformed their community through consistent, passionate service.
- Has dedicated their life to supporting those most in need with compassion and dignity.

The Neighbourhood Champion Award celebrates the unsung heroes of Gloucestershire communities. This award seeks to celebrate individuals who are making a real difference to people and places in their neighbourhoods.

This award might be appropriate for someone who:

- Consistently volunteers their time to support community initiatives.
- Offers support to their neighbours (such as helping with their garden, walking dogs or checking in on them).
- Makes our streets, villages, towns or cities more caring, supportive or welcoming and better places to live.

The Corporate Volunteering Award celebrates the organisations that go above and beyond to support their local community or causes. Corporate Volunteering can have an incredible impact in our communities, often enabling charities or groups to achieve big projects which wouldn't otherwise be possible.

Organisations nominated for this award might:

- Have an Employer Supported Volunteering (ESV) policy and actively encourage employees to volunteer during work time.
- Facilitate staff volunteering (such as team days and trusteeship).
- Be able to demonstrate the positive impact that their volunteering has made.

## Volunteer Impact Award

The Volunteer Impact Award celebrates those volunteers who have made a significant positive impact to the lives of others. This award shines a light on those who go above and beyond to support others.

This award might be appropriate for someone who:

- Has had a significant positive impact through their volunteering.
- Acts as a role model for other volunteers, supporting, guiding and inspiring others in their team.

## Children and young person's support volunteer Award

This award celebrates volunteers who go above and beyond in supporting services for children and young people. From raising school funds, to running youth groups, reading with children and supporting young families, this award is for volunteers who make a real difference to young people's lives.

This award might be appropriate for someone who:

- Volunteers their time supporting any cause related to children and young people, include those that support children and young people indirectly (e.g. PTAs).
- Creates safe, supportive spaces where children and young people can be themselves.
- Runs youth groups, children's clubs, activities, and programs that build confidence and skills.
- Helps young voices be heard and empower youth to make positive choices.
- Goes above and beyond to support vulnerable children and young people.

The Volunteer of the Year Award is awarded to the volunteer who judges feel exemplifies the community spirit, consistency and compassion which volunteers are known and loved for. **This award will be selected by our panel of judges from all the nominations received from the following categories: Rising Star Award, Trustee of the Year Award, Sports Volunteer Award, Volunteer Impact Award, Lifetime Achievement Award, Neighbourhood Champion Award, Children and Young People's Volunteer Award.**

## FAQs

### Who can be nominated?

Award Category	Who can be nominated?
Trustee of the Year Award	<b>Individuals</b> who are aged 18 and over who have held a voluntary trustee/director position for at least one year within Gloucestershire
Rising Star Award	<b>Individuals</b> under 18 years of age (at the time of nomination) who are currently volunteering within Gloucestershire
Lifetime Achievement Award	<b>Individuals</b> who are aged 18 and over and have volunteered for ten or more years within Gloucestershire
Children and Young People's Volunteer Award	<b>Individuals</b> aged 18 and over whose volunteer role supports children and young people aged under 18 within Gloucestershire
Sports Volunteer Award	<b>Individuals</b> aged 18 and over whose volunteer role supports sporting activities within Gloucestershire
Volunteer Impact Award	<b>Individuals</b> aged 18 and over who are currently volunteering within Gloucestershire
Neighbourhood Champion Award	<b>Individuals</b> aged 18 and over who are currently volunteering within Gloucestershire
Community Group Award	<b>Volunteer-led groups</b> delivering services within Gloucestershire
Corporate Volunteering Award	<b>Organisations</b> (including limited companies, limited liability partnerships, social enterprises and charities) that currently operate an Employer Supported Volunteering scheme for employees.
Best Organisation to Volunteer With in 2026	<b>Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise organisations</b> that benefit from volunteers.
